



Wildcards for searching for records

6	Finds all records. For example; %International Finds all Client records that have something before International in their company name. International% Finds all Client records that have something after International in their company name.
	Finds a single unknown character. For example; SM?THJ Finds John Smith, James Smith, John Smyth, and Jane Smith.
	Finds one or more unknown character. For example; SM*THJ Finds John Smith, James Smith, John Smyth, Jane Smith, and Jar Smeath. Enter * on its own to display all the items in the database.
...]	The area within a set of square brackets represents one character. The database matches anything within the square brackets. For example; NE1[] looks for postcode NE1 only and not NE11 or NE12 because the 4th character must be a space. NE1[12] looks for postcodes NE11 and NE12 only because the 4th character must be a 1 or a 2. This can be very useful for controlled postcode lookup.

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
